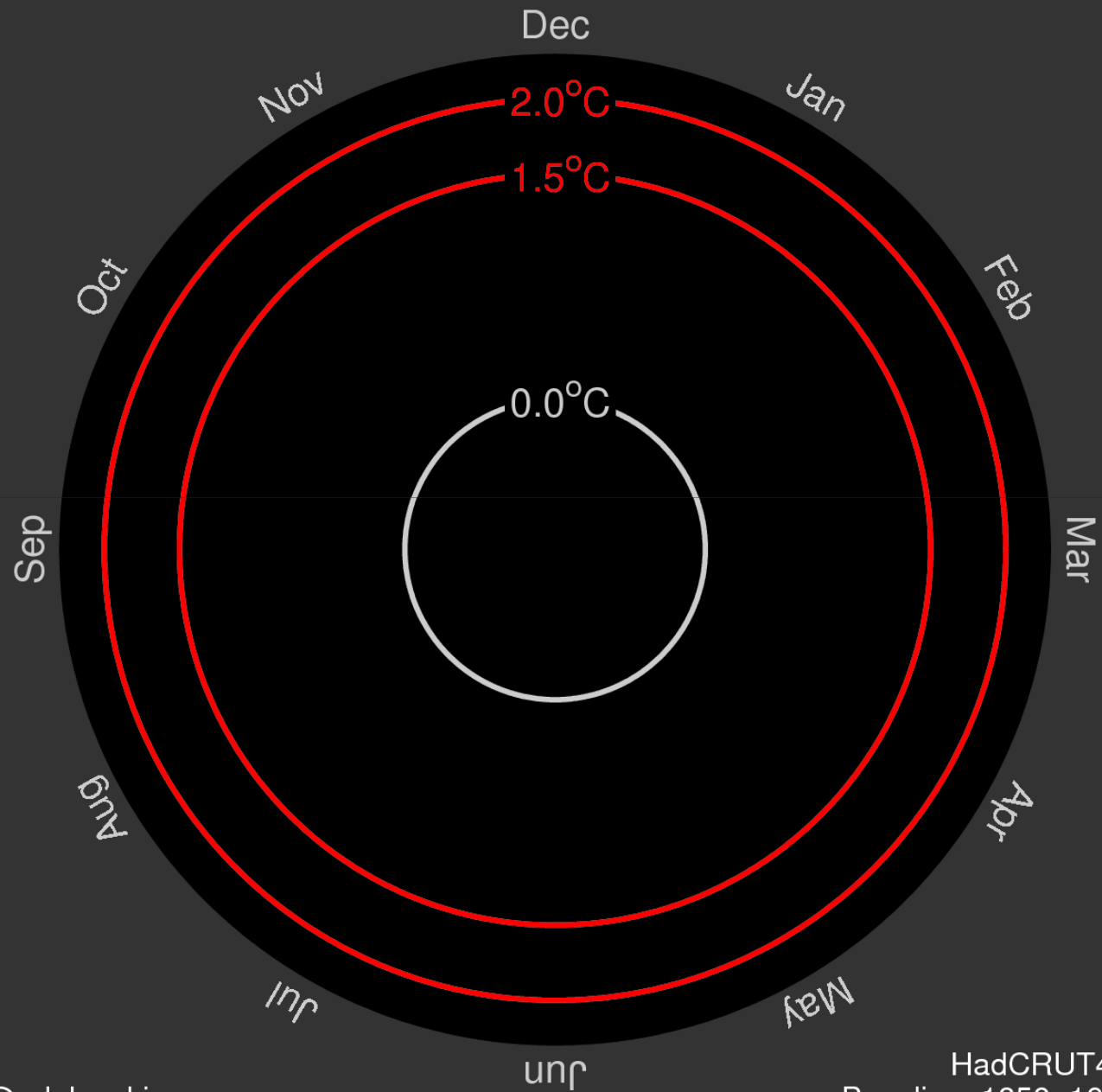


Global temperature change (1850–2017)

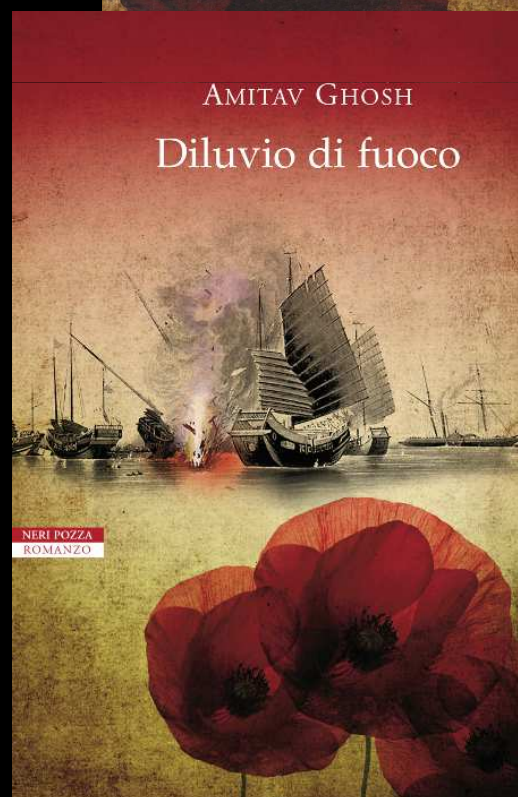
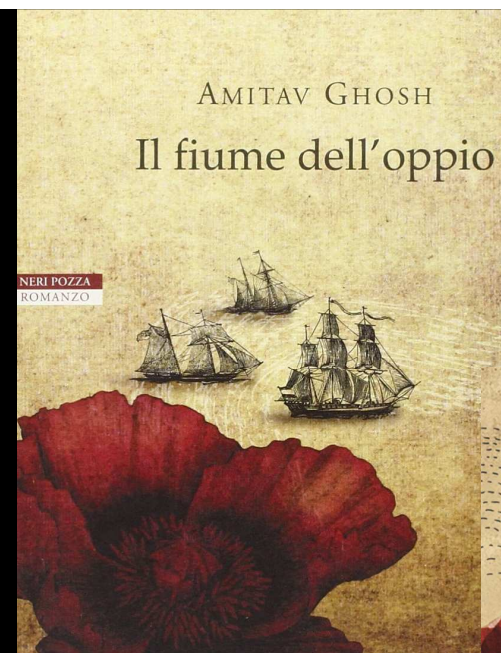


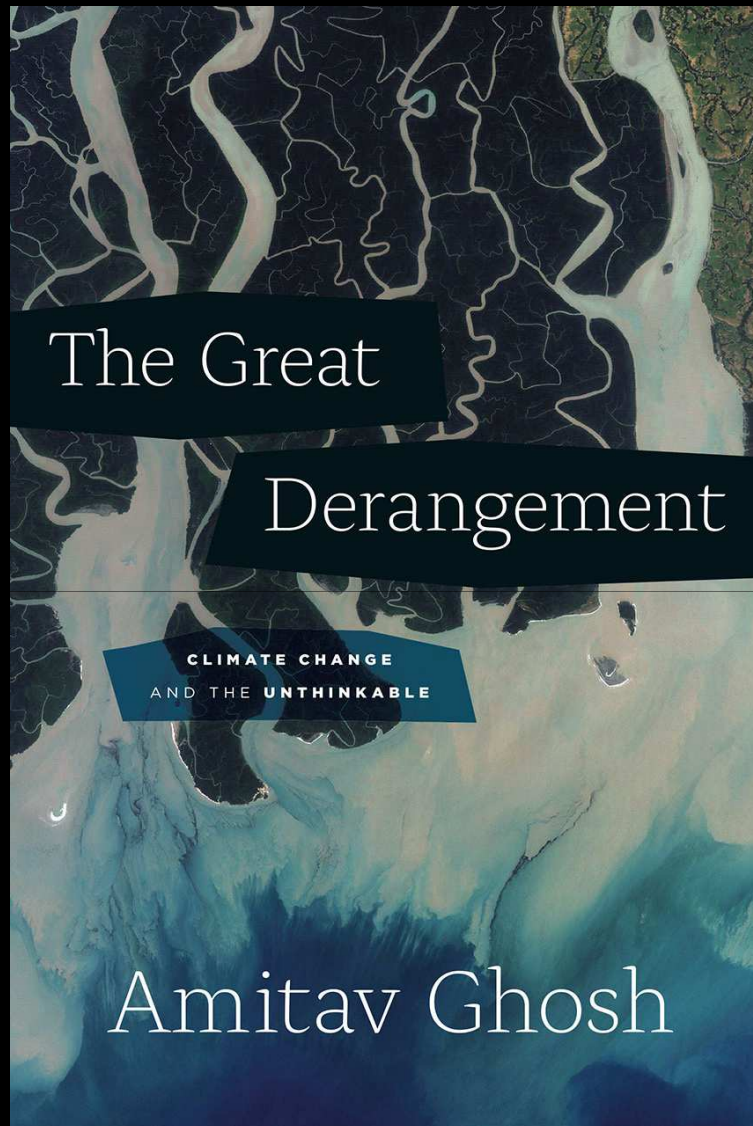

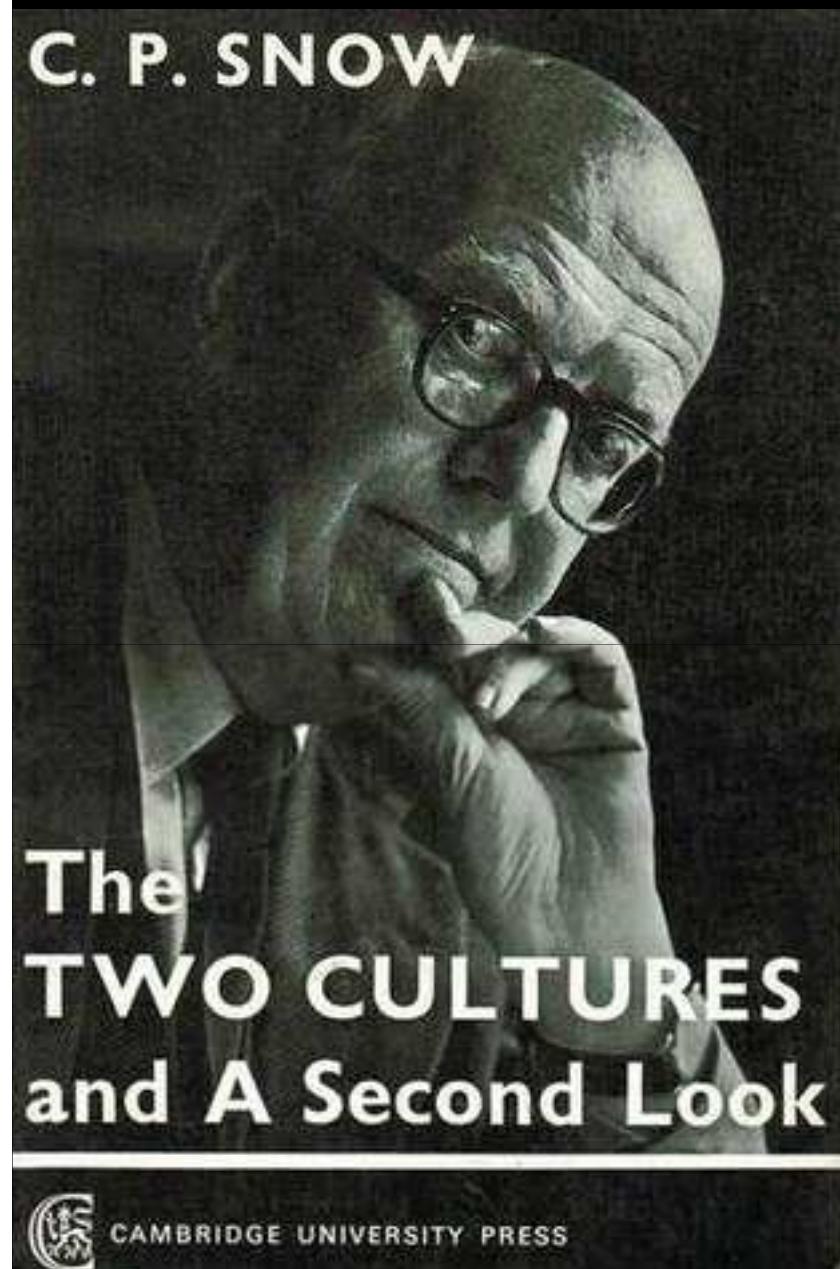

Baseline: 1850–1900





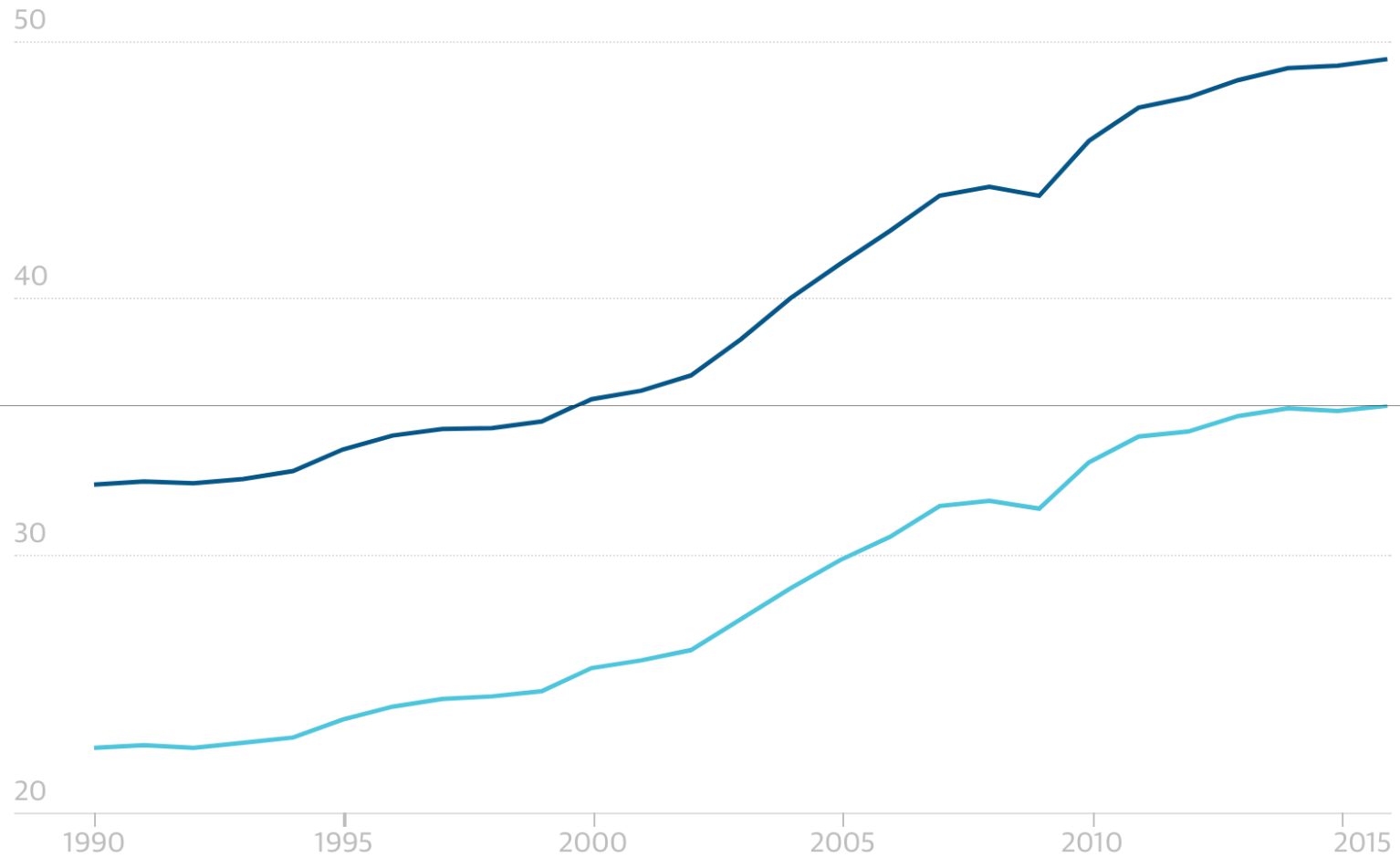

■ Total CO2 ■ Total greenhouse gases



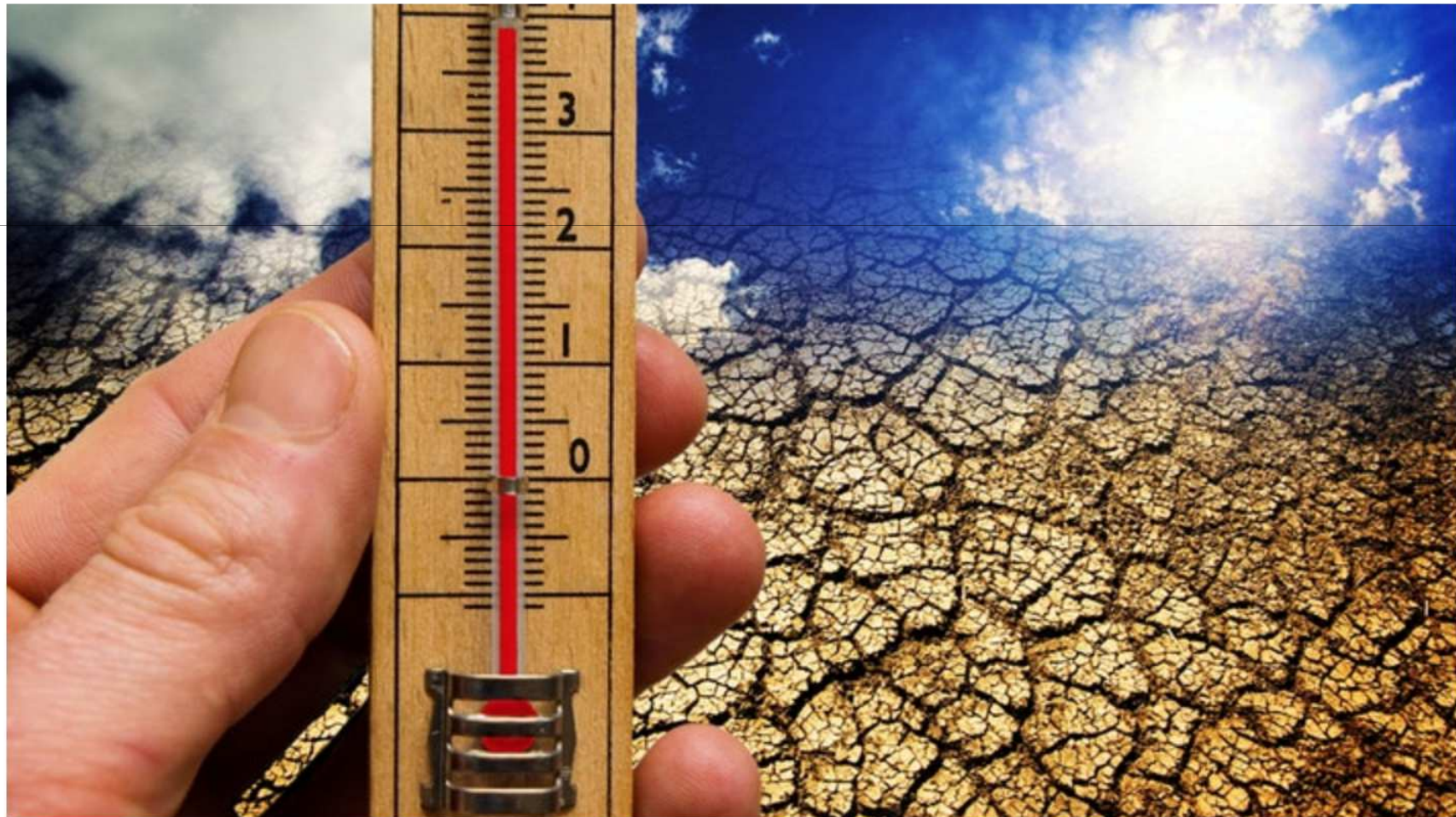

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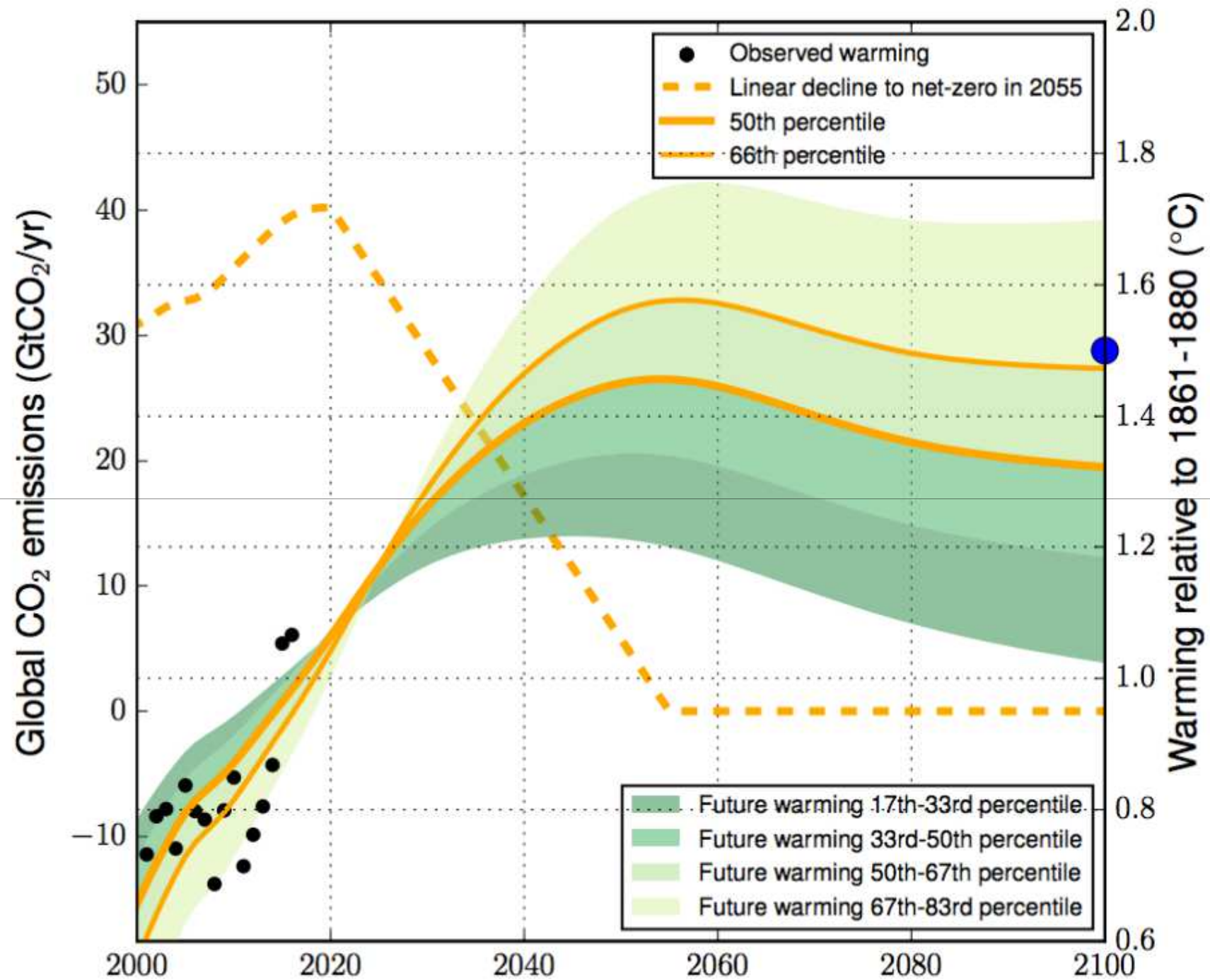
